## **Facts**

About one in three (30%) of women worldwide have experienced either physical and/or sexual intimate partner violence or non-partner sexual violence in their lifetime.	http://www.who.int/mediacentre/factsheets/fs239/en/
<b>27%</b> of women aged 15-49 years who have been in a relationship report that they have been subjected to some form of physical and/or sexual violence by their intimate partner.	http://www.who.int/mediacentre/factsheets/fs239/en/

The regions of Oceania, Southern Asia and Sub-Saharan Africa have the highest prevalence rates of intimate partner violence among women aged 15-49, ranging from 33%-51%. The first sexual experience of some <b>30%</b> of women was forced. 80% of the estimated 800,000 people trafficked across national borders annually are women and girls, with the majority (79 percent) trafficked for sexual exploitation. Sexual violence, particularly during childhood, can lead to increased smoking, substance use, and risky sexual behaviors. It is also associated with perpetration of violence (for males) and being a victim of violence (for females).	http://www.who.int/mediacentre/factsheets/fs239/en/
Women who had been physically or sexually abused were <b>1.5 times</b> more likely to have a sexually transmitted infection and, in some regions, HIV, compared to women who had not experienced partner violence.	https://www.who.int/en/news-room/fact-sheets/detail/violence-against-women

It is estimated that more than <b>200 million</b> girls and women alive today have undergone female genital mutilation (FGM) in the countries where the practice is concentrated. Women and girls are disproportionately affected by modern slavery, accounting for 28.7 million, or 71% of the overall total. A 2014 study based on interviews with women across the 28 Member States of the European Union revealed that only 14% of women reported their most serious incident of intimate partner violence to the police, and 13% reported their most serious incident of non-partner violence to the police.	https://fra.europa.eu/sites/default/files/fra_uploads/fra- 2014-vaw-survey-main-results-apr14_en.pdf
Before the COVID-19 pandemic, more than <b>100 million</b> girls were expected to marry before their eighteenth birthday in the next decade. Now, up to 10 million more girls will be at risk of becoming child brides as a result of the pandemic. Girls who marry before 18 are more likely to experience domestic violence and less likely to remain in school. They have worse economic and health outcomes than their unmarried peers, which are eventually passed down to their own children, further straining a country's capacity to provide quality health and education services.	https://www.unicef.org/protection/child-marriage
